Nasdaq-100 Quarterly Protective Put 90 Index	The Underlying Index measures the performance of a risk management strategy that holds the underlying stocks of the NASDAQ 100 Index and applies a protective put strategy (i.e. long (purchased) put options) on the Nasdaq 100 Index. The Underlying Index specifically reflects the performance of the component securites of the NASDAQ 100 Index, combined with a long position in 10% out-of-the-money ("OTM") put options that correspond to the value of the portfolio of stocks in the NASDAQ 100 Index.

The Nasdaq-100 Index includes 100 of the largest domestic and international non-financial companies listed on The Nasdaq Stock Market based on market capitalization. The Index reflects companies across major industry groups including computer hardware and software. telecommunications, retail/wholesale trade and biotechnology.
